Soil Preparation

Great gardens start with great soil!
Soil preparation is essential for successful gardening.

Healthy soil should have good tilth, nutrient content, and a viable population of beneficial microorganisms. We recommend using natural and organic ingredients to prepare the soil and maintain soil fertility. It is always a good idea to have a soil test to identify your soil type (sandy, loam, silt, clay) and find out your soil pH.

NOTE: It is important to store correctly until planting. Store in a cool, dry place with plenty of air circulation. Plant in spring as soon as ground has thawed and soil has warmed to 50°F and is workable. Usually 4-6 weeks after the last frost.

Raspberry Planting Instructions

- 1 Plant raspberries in early spring after the ground has thawed and there is no longer danger of frost.
- 2 Choose a location with well-drained soil that receives full sun. Loosen soil prior to planting.
- 3 Remove plant from packaging and lightly loosen the bottom of the root ball to release the roots. Dig a hole in loosened soil as deep as the roots and about twice as wide. Be sure the hole is large enough to encompass the roots without bending them.
- 4 Place plant in hole with the roots down and the crown/top of the roots about 1" below soil surface. Space plants 3' apart in rows 6' apart.
- 5 Cover with soil and water well so that the soil settles. Keep soil moist during periods of dry weather but do not overwater.

* The bush will bear only on one-year-old stems. As soon as canes have produced fruit, prune them back to the ground to make room for the strong new canes.

* Plants will produce a small amount of fruit after being planted, with more plentiful crops occurring on plants that are 2-4 years old.

Garden State Bulb Raspberry Brandywine bare roots come from our farms and growers in the US. Each root is hand picked and checked for quality before shipment. Gardeners have long favored this raspberry for its exceptional fruit qualities, including its size, flavor, firmness, and sweetness. The Brandywine Purple Raspberry, a cross between red and black raspberry plants, offers a distinct and intense sweetness with delicate floral undertones. These popular plants yield abundant harvests of delicious raspberries, starting in summer and lasting until the first frost. Whether you prefer to enjoy them fresh or use them for various culinary purposes like making jams, jellies, sauces, canning, or freezing, Brandywine Purple Raspberries are a versatile choice. Additionally, when cultivating these plants, you can anticipate a small initial harvest in the first growing season, a larger yield in the second season, and a full harvest by the fourth season.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q. How long can you wait to plant raspberry bare roots?

A. You can delay planting the bare roots for approximately two to three weeks if you are able to keep them from drying out. It is recommended to plant early spring as soon as the ground is workable.

Q. What type of soil do raspberry brandywine grow best in?

A. Raspberries grow best in organically rich, slightly acidic, moist, and well drained soil.

Q. What should not be planted near raspberries?

A. We recommend raspberries to not be planted near black raspberries or alongside nightshades like eggplant, potato, or tomatoes.
